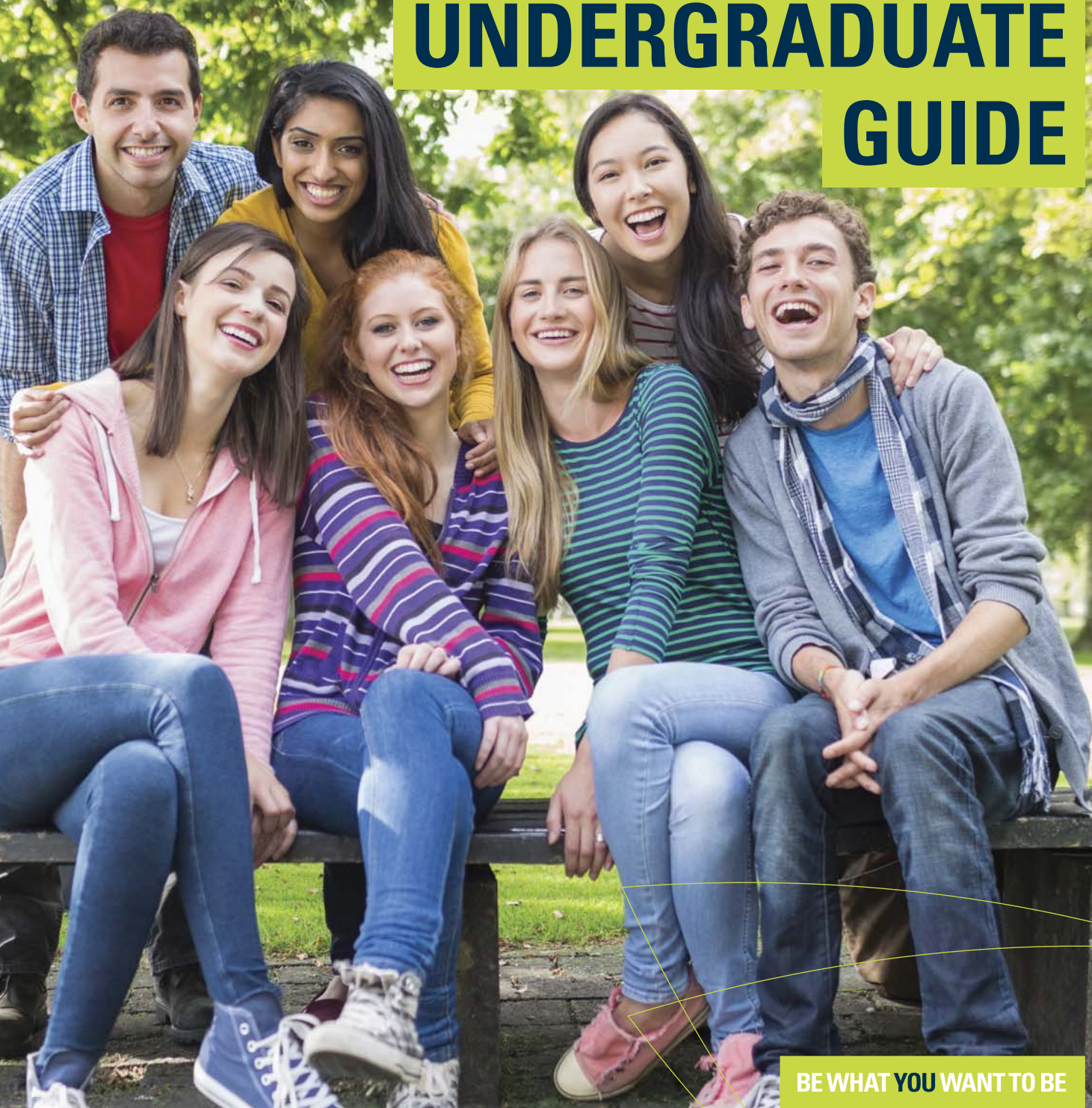

CQUNIVERSITY GLADSTONE CITY AND GLADSTONE MARINA

The Gladstone area is a region of diversity – tourism, community and industry co-exist in harmony, retaining an agreeable lifestyle and environment balance. We have two campuses in Gladstone. The picturesque Gladstone Marina campus is located next to the harbour and houses the University’s Engineering and Environment Management Complex dedicated to engineering research and training. The campus environment provides a unique platform for learning and research, with modern buildings and spacious grounds.



CQUNIVERSITY BUNDABERG

Bundaberg is located in the agricultural belt of Queensland, making it an ideal campus to study agribusiness and horticulture. It is the only campus which offers programs in aviation. We have world-leading experts delivering programs from bachelor to masters levels. The campus is situated on large grounds with clinical nursing and scientific laboratories, multimedia and sound studios, and boasts interactive electronically transmitted lectures to integrate with other campuses.



CQUNIVERSITY BRISBANE

Brisbane is a vibrant city with a relaxed outdoor lifestyle encompassing 115 days of sunshine a year. Our modern Brisbane campus is centrally located next to the Ann Street Shopping precinct, City Hall, Central Station and walking distance to the State Library, Botanic Gardens and Southbank Parklands. The campus has modern computer laboratories, recreational areas and a dedicated student services floor. It is also a delivery site for CQUniversity English, which runs general and academic English programs from elementary to advanced levels.



CQUNIVERSITY MELBOURNE

Consistently voted as the world’s most liveable city and best student cities, Melbourne is also known as the fashion, cultural, sporting and social innovation capital of Australia. The Melbourne campus is a newly refurbished multi-million dollar premise located opposite the city’s main public transport hub. It is a delivery site for CQUniversity English programs, and has a strong focus on social innovation and sustainability issues. A range of complimentary workshops including Microsoft Office training and academic support. The Campus Life Committee has a variety of social and cultural activities for its diverse student cohort of over 50 nationalities.

NEW CAMPUSES

CQUniversity has a new multi-million dollar campus in Townsville – a thriving regional city in Queensland. The Townsville campus features brand new paramedic science clinics and computer laboratories for professional communication students. The University is also planning campus registration for Cairns, located in northern Queensland.



CQUNIVERSITY MACKAY CITY AND MACKAY OORALEA

Mackay is a relaxed tropical city with near perfect weather all year round. Take free tours of the historic city and botanic gardens, ride a bike on the award-winning Bluewater Trail, or swim in the Blue Lagoon leisure park. Our resort-style Mackay Ooralea campus offers modern facilities for nursing, engineering and the trades, and the internationally-regarded Central Queensland Conservatorium of Music. Adjacent to the campus is a new health precinct where our allied health students work alongside medical professionals. Two multi-million dollar infrastructure projects are being planned involving educational engineering and health related facilities.



CQUNIVERSITY ROCKHAMPTON CITY AND ROCKHAMPTON NORTH

Rockhampton is located in a cattle farming region, and is within close proximity to the Great Barrier Reef, Keppel Island and Queensland's best beaches. CQUniversity Rockhampton is the University's largest campus and is a delivery site for CQUniversity English. The campus is set on acres of parkland with over 30 academic buildings, sporting facilities, a student residence, multi-faith centre and many other facilities. There is also the recently refurbished on-campus library, new paramedic sciences laboratories, Coronary Care Skills Centre and the new Allied Health Clinic to enhance student learning.



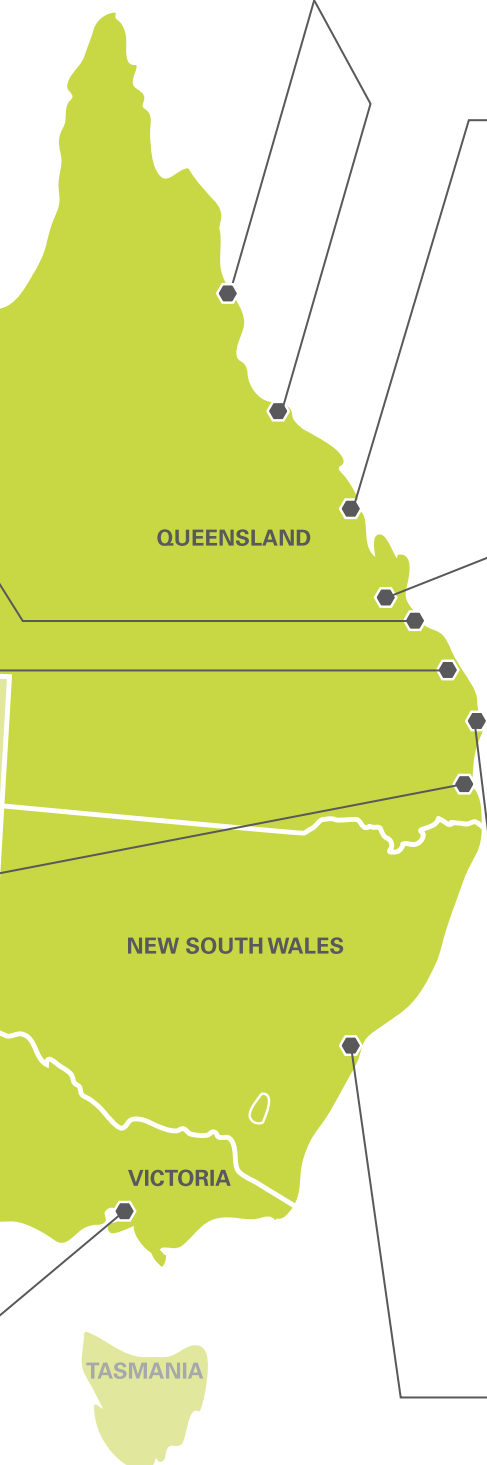
CQUNIVERSITY NOOSA

Noosa is a coastal community well known internationally for its surfing, beaches, pristine rivers and national parks. It is situated on the edge of a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve and close to the World Heritage site of Fraser Island, making CQUniversity Noosa an excellent place to study conservation and the environment. The campus also offers programs in nursing, allied health and education and is supported by clinical nursing laboratories, collaborative learning spaces and is home to the Learning and Teaching Education Research Centre (LTERC).

Sydney is an exciting fast-paced city and is the business and finance engine of Australia, and home to the iconic Sydney Opera House, Darling Harbour Bridge and Bondi Beach. The city offers plenty of cultural, social and outdoor activities including bushwalk and skiing nearby. CQUniversity Sydney is the University's largest metropolitan campus and is located near the main Town Hall Train Station. The campus offers the largest selection of programs for international students and encompasses CQUniversity English, a multi-purpose student recreation area, extensive library, computer facilities, videoconferencing rooms, and modern chiropractic laboratories.



A UNIVERSITY THAT GIVES BACK

CQUniversity is committed to social responsibility and strive to integrate this into everything that we do to make the world a better place. We are giving back to communities in Australia and abroad through partnerships, overseas student placements, sponsorships, fundraising, volunteering projects, sustainable practices and research activities.

CQUniversity has been supporting the Salaam Baalak Trust, which runs orphanages in New Delhi for street children and has a training program for these children to become tour guides in New Delhi. This partnership also creates volunteering opportunities for our nursing students to work there to gain practical experience.

Similarly, our nursing and education students have assisted with teaching in Vietnam, our nursing students have undertaken clinical placements in Nepal, and interdisciplinary student teams have worked together within communities in the Philippines.

Our students benefit by gaining practical experience in applying their knowledge and skills, and deepening their understanding of working in different cultural and social environments. This will in turn prepare them to work in an increasingly multicultural world.



SOCIAL INNOVATION

CQUniversity is committed to social innovation education, which gives our students the tools to create solutions to social problems that are effective, efficient and sustainable and provides value to society as a whole, rather than to private individuals.

We are embedding social innovation into our curriculum and co-curricular activities. Through curriculum we aim to teach our students about the principles of social innovation, incorporating basics like design thinking from a basis of empathy, and the importance of transdisciplinary approaches to finding solutions to systemic problems. In 2016, we will be offering postgraduate study in social innovation and introducing elements of social innovation throughout our programs.

In July 2015, we successfully implemented a unique social innovation initiative – the Gladstone Region Social Innovation Incubator (GRSII). This initiative brought students, community, business and industry together to work in teams to develop sustainable and socially innovative projects for the fast growing region of Gladstone, Queensland. It provided an opportunity for students from all disciplines to learn to work collaboratively and develop employability skills such as teamwork, design-thinking strategies, communication, initiative and self management.

By studying at a university that aspires to become a social innovation hub, you have the opportunity to learn in a supportive environment where talent for social enterprise is nurtured and developed. You will gain invaluable interdisciplinary, entrepreneurial and problem-solving skills that will prepare you for success in a dynamic and changing world.

In an increasingly competitive global environment, CQUniversity is committed to ensuring that you have the skills, competence and connections needed to build a successful career. Many of our programs are accredited by professional bodies in Australia and overseas, and developed in consultation with industry to ensure that you gain up-to-date and relevant knowledge to prepare you for a seamless entry into the workforce.

We also implement interdisciplinary learning, simulated real-world activities, internships and work integrated learning opportunities into our programs to ensure that our students graduate career ready. Some examples can be found below.

WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING

Internships

In 2015, to meet the increasing demands of employers for career ready graduates, we introduced internships to a selected number of programs with plans to include more programs. Currently, a 10-week internship is available for students studying the Bachelor of Information Technology, and is being introduced to the Bachelor of Business in 2016. The School of Business and Law has committed to doing this and is currently working on it for a Term 1, 2016 start.

The internship is sourced by CQUniversity and our partner, Australian Internships – a market leader in career development programs for international candidates.

Clinical Placements

Students studying chiropractic, nursing, physiotherapy, podiatry, and occupational therapy are required by accrediting industry bodies to undertake clinical placements. The placements can take place with external providers which the University has strong industry links with. For those studying at CQUniversity's Mackay Ooralea and Rockhampton North campuses, the on-campus health clinics provides allied health students the opportunity to learn from health professionals and deliver supervised healthcare to students and the local community.

Industrial Placements

Engineers Australia is the accrediting body in Australia and requires engineering students to show that they are capable of 'personally conducting and managing an engineering project to achieve a substantial outcome to professional standards'. In our Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) and Diploma of Professional Practice (Co-op) degree, students will undertake 48 weeks of work placement as well as project-based learning, to develop the professional skills required to work as an Engineer and graduate with one year of industry experience.

CQUNI CAREERS

CQUni Careers offers career support services to prospective and current students as well as graduates in achieving their career development profession aspirations through career education, guidance and information. The team is dedicated to helping you build your employability and job search skills as you prepare to be career ready in your chosen field. Current students are also able to access the online portal, CareerHub, to search for casual or part-time job vacancies.

CQUNIVERSITY CAREER CONNECTION

CQUniversity Career Connection is our new careers mentoring program that connects our alumni to current students to provide them with career preparation, and to promote their confidence and success. Students will be able to access a database of potential mentors, communicate with them via phone or email, and gain career advice. The free mentoring program will enable our students to benefit from the skills and knowledge of our successful alumni.

STUDYING AT CQUNIVERSITY

STUDY MODES

CQUniversity offers programs that can be studied in a number of modes including on-campus or by distance education. You can also undertake a blend of the two study modes provided you meet specific requirements as detailed below.

On-campus

If you are in Australia on a student visa you must study full-time on-campus. Whilst in Australia, you are able to undertake some courses within your program by distance education/online provided it is no more than 25 percent of your entire program; approved by the University; and not entirely by distance education/online in a compulsory term.

Distance Education

Distance education programs are only available to international students who do not live in Australia. If you wish to study by distance education, please note that you can study part-time or full-time; and may be required to attend a residential school in Australia for a short period of time to fulfil the requirements of the program. Please refer to the distance education section of this guide.

TEACHING METHODS

Whether you study on-campus or by distance education/online, there will be avenues for engagement with lecturers, tutors and fellow students to enrich your learning experience.

Our small class sizes ensure that you have more one-on-one interaction with your lecturers and tutors who will monitor your academic progress. Assessments include written and practical tests, online quizzes, participation in group discussions and final examinations at the end of each term. Some courses may involve supervised off-campus work placements which form a large part of the course content and assessment.

FULL OR PART-TIME STUDY

A standard full-time study load consists of four courses per term, with a part-time study load consisting of one or two courses per term. Part-time study is only available to international students who do not live in Australia.

THREE TERM SYSTEM

CQUniversity offers three terms per year – beginning of the year (Term 1), mid-year (Term 2) or towards the end of the year (Term 3). This enables some programs to offer three intakes per year, providing the flexibility to start your study at a time more convenient to you, or to fast-track your study to get into the workforce sooner.

GLOBAL OPPORTUNITIES

CQUGlobal Inbound programs

If you are studying at an overseas institution, you can study part of your award with us for a few weeks, one term or a full academic year and transfer study credits back to your home institution. This is a perfect opportunity to experience our range of exciting programs and vibrant campus locations, and what Australia has to offer. CQUGlobal Outbound programs

As a CQUniversity student, you can study for a term or academic year at one of our partner institutions whilst remaining enrolled with us. In most cases, you can combine study and travel without extending your program duration, and gain credit for the courses studied abroad. This can be a life-changing experience that develops your intercultural awareness, communication skills, and competitive edge in the global job market. DISTANCE EDUCATION

Distance education refers to study undertaken off-campus or online, hence you are not required to attend regular classes on-campus. You will complete the same coursework and graduate with the same qualification as students who study on-campus. It provides the flexibility to study at your own pace at home, work or wherever you can access the Internet.

WHY CHOOSE DISTANCE EDUCATION AT CQUNIVERSITY

Being one of Australia's leading providers of distance education, we believe education transcends physical boundaries. With plans to further expand our distance education offerings, we are enthusiastically responding to a world that is increasingly dependent on information technology.

In addition to complete access to advanced online learning technologies and support from specialist teaching staff, you will also benefit in the following ways:

- » a selection of programs in a wide range of fields spanning business, engineering, information technology, medical sciences and more to choose from
- » flexible study load (no minimum courses per term)
- » if your chosen program is professionally accredited, this will not be affected
- » most programs are offered three terms per year so you can choose to start at a time that best suits you
- » the majority of our distance education programs are available entirely by distance, which means you will not need a student visa and you can still continue with your current lifestyle and/or your work commitment in your home country
- » you could save over AUD18 000* per year on living expenses.

*This is based on Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) financial requirements of AUD 18 610 per year for living expenses in which an international student must demonstrate that they are able to access.

SUPPORT FOR DISTANCE EDUCATION STUDENTS

We have put in place a network of experienced staff and support services that are available for use at any time from wherever you might be studying. Some of these support services include:

- » electronic library
- » study material provided in hard copy or online
- » access to recorded lectures online and lecturers who guide and support you
- » study groups and online discussion forums
- » weekend or online orientation sessions.

RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS

A number of our distance education programs require you to attend residential schools, which involve a period of time that you must spend on-campus in Australia to fulfil the program and course requirements.

We offer a number of alternative entry pathways to help you meet the English language and/or academic requirements of our undergraduate programs as outlined in the diagram below.



ENGLISH LANGUAGE PATHWAY

Studying the relevant English language program at CQUniversity will enable you to gain entry into various academic programs with us. For more information visit www.cqu.edu.au/english.

CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA PATHWAY

You can complete a CQUniversity certificate or diploma to gain entry to the first or second year of your relevant undergraduate degree. This pathway also gives you a standalone qualification. Alternatively, if you already hold an Australian diploma or its equivalent, you may gain entry to the first or second year (with advanced standing) of a wide variety of undergraduate degrees.

FOUNDATION STUDIES PATHWAY

CQUniversity Foundation Studies is a pathway program specifically developed for international students who do not meet the academic entry requirements for selected CQUniversity's undergraduate programs, in the areas of Business, Accounting, IT and Digital Media.

This two term program is also ideal for students who have not completed the equivalent of 12 years of schooling in their home country.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

If you have previously studied at another educational provider within the last ten years, or have professional experience, you can apply for RPL (also known as advanced standing, credit exemption and credit transfer) to help you meet the entry requirements of our degree programs. RPL is assessed individually upon application, and if approved may reduce the duration of your study program.

STREAMLINED VISA PROCESSING (SVP) PARTNERS

CQUniversity participates in the Streamlined Visa Processing (SVP) arrangements. If you already hold an Australian TAFE qualification or equivalent from one of our SVP partner institutions, you may use your qualification to gain entry into selected diplomas and degrees at CQUniversity.

LIVING IN AUSTRALIA

Australia is one of the safest and most stable places to live in the world, with our cities ranked as some of the most liveable due to the high level of education, safety, healthcare, infrastructure, culture and environment (Global Liveability Survey 2014).

COST OF LIVING

The cost of living varies depending on the location, accommodation type, lifestyle choice and if you have any dependents. It is generally cheaper to live in on-campus and shared accommodation than in a one bedroom or studio apartment. Below is a sample guide on living costs in each state to help you prepare a budget.

STUDENTS UNDER 18

If you are under 18 years of age, Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) requires that you:

- » have an approved guardian until you turn 18 years of age
- » reside in a CQUniversity approved accommodation.

CQUniversity has engaged the services of International Student Alliance (Guardian and Welfare Service) to provide appropriate accommodation for students under 18 years of age. For more information visit www.studentguardians.com or contact us.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public transport may include travel by bus, train, tram or ferry depending on where you live. Many of CQUniversity campuses are conveniently located within close proximity to main transport hubs. Some states provide students with discounted public transport fares and utilise ticketing systems such as smartcards that provide an easier and cheaper way to travel.

New South Wales (NSW)

International students can purchase a special International Student 90-day or 365-day MyMulti ticket which provides unlimited travel in the zones you choose (MyMulti 2 or 3) including travel on public transport in Greater Sydney, the Hunter and the Illawarra. If your study is fully funded by specified Australian Government scholarships, you may be eligible for transport concessions. For more information visit www.transportnsw.info/international-students.

Queensland

International students studying in Queensland are eligible to apply for a concession card through the Department of Transport and Main Roads each year. The application forms are also available on-campus. For more information visit www.tmr.qld.gov.au/.

Victoria

In 2015, a new Free Tram Zone in Melbourne CBD has been introduced, along with the new iUSE pass initiative which allows international students studying an undergraduate or vocational education full-time to purchase a half-price annual myki ticket for the zone/s in which they study. VISA INFORMATION

To study in Australia you will need a student visa, and the type of student visa will depend on the study that you undertake. DIBP is responsible for providing advice and issuing visas on entry to Australia, and you may also contact your nearest Australian Embassy, Consulate-General, Consulate or High Commission.

HEALTH COVER

DIBP requires all student visa holders to have Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of their studies. CQUniversity has a preferred arrangement in place with Allianz Global Assistance — a recognised health insurance provider for international students in Australia.

The University requires that you pay for your OSHC when you pay for your tuition fees. This will ensure that you have health cover upon arrival in Australia. The cost of OSHC will depend on the type of cover you need. For more information visit www.oshcallianzassistance.com.au.

WORKING WHILE STUDYING

International students studying in Australia on a student visa are able to work part-time and do not need to apply for a work visa. Student visa holders are permitted to work up to 40 hours per fortnight during term, and unlimited hours during term breaks. 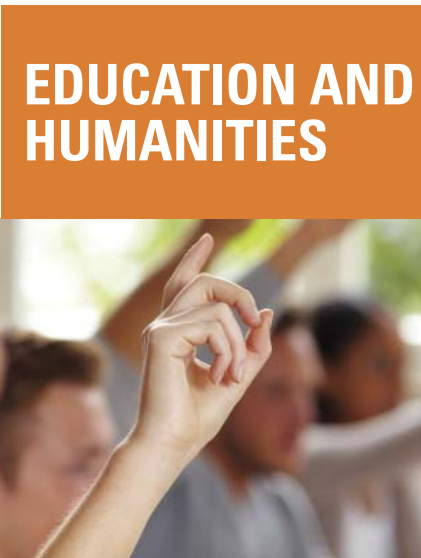

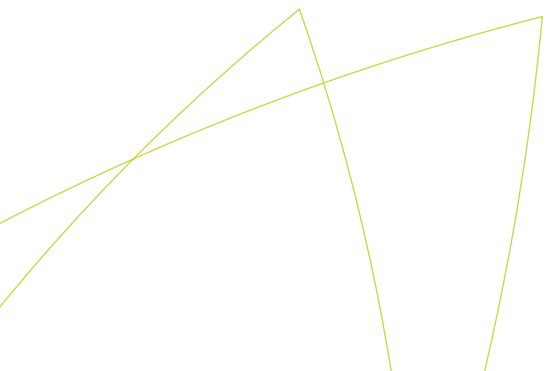

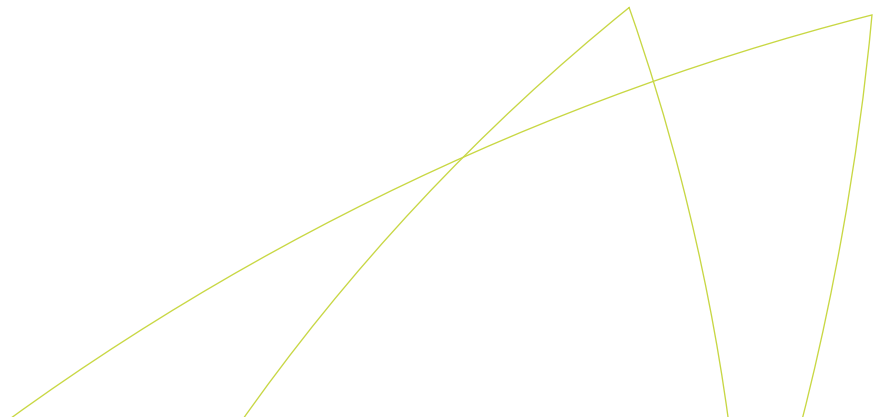

CQUNIVERSITY TERMINOLOGY

Associate degree	An associate degree is designed to qualify you at the para-professional level. This program can also provide a pathway into a bachelor degree.
Bachelor degree	A bachelor degree is usually the first program studied at university. Completion of a bachelor degree is required for entry into a number of professional careers.
Census date	The last day a student may withdraw their enrolment from a course without incurring financial or academic penalty.
Certificate I – IV	Certificate I to IV are a set of qualifications awarded in the VET sector. The four levels of certificates recognise increasing levels of skills.
Course	A course (may also be referred to as subject or unit at other institutions) is a component of a program. A standard three year bachelor degree consists of 24 courses.
Diploma and advanced diploma	Diploma and advanced diploma provide a VET qualification that prepares you for work that requires a broad range of complex technical skills and in-depth knowledge in a chosen vocational area.
Distance education	Also known as flexible study, flex, external, off-campus or online study. Principally there is no need to regularly attend classes on-campus.
Full-time load	Full-time is defined as 100 percent of a nominal full-time load. International students must maintain a standard full-time academic load of 48 units of credit across the academic year (or 24 units of credit per term) to fulfil visa requirements.
Graduate certificate	A graduate certificate provides specialised study in a specific subject area, with the opportunity to progress to a graduate diploma and/or masters upon completion.
Graduate diploma	A graduate diploma is designed for those who have already completed a bachelor degree or equivalent, or have significant professional or industry experience in a relevant area. A graduate diploma enables you to develop skills in a specialised area, or move in a new career direction.
Honours	An honours program is an additional year of study full-time, or part-time equivalent, beyond a bachelor degree. Honours is designed for those who wish to extend their knowledge in a major area of specialisation or continue on to study a research higher degree.
International student	An international student is a person who is not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or an Australian Permanent Resident. An international student may hold an Australian student visa, or they may be in Australia on a different visa, or they may reside outside Australia and enrol in distance education.
Masters by coursework	Masters by coursework programs teach a series of specialist courses designed to extend your professional understanding in a particular subject area, or provide you with an opportunity to move in a new professional direction.
Part-time load	A part-time study load consists of one to two courses per term. International students may only study part-time in Australia if allowed under their visa conditions.
Postgraduate	Higher-level study usually undertaken after the completion of an undergraduate degree. Examples are graduate certificate, graduate diploma, master or doctorate.
Program	A program is the combination of courses that make up the full award, such as a Bachelor of Arts.
Research higher degree	A program at masters or doctoral level in which more than two-thirds of the study required, taken across the whole program, is research rather than coursework.
Technical and Further Education (TAFE)	An organisation which is recognised or has been recognised in the past by the relevant State or Territory education authority as being a technical and further education institution.
Term	A term is a 12 week period of time (normally with a vacation week during the period) when lectures and tutorials are held and when assessment pieces fall due. This may also be called a semester by other universities.
Undergraduate	Normally the first degree undertaken at university. Examples are diploma, associate degree or bachelor.
Vocational Education and Training	Vocational education and training provides skills and knowledge for work, enhances employability and assists learning throughout life.
