**7.00 am:** Beat the crowds and get along to one of the many outdoor markets that happen every weekend around Brisbane. Buy fresh organic food from local farmers and grocers, grab a coffee, sample some of the many cuisines on offer, and listen to live music.

**10.00 am:** Take a bus, ferry, train or city cycle to South Bank – Brisbane's cultural precinct, and home of Griffith's Queensland College of Art and Queensland Conservatorium of Music. Wander along the river front, swim at the man-made beach, visit the art galleries, ride the Wheel of Brisbane and pick some herbs from 'Epicurious', a public vegetable and herb garden.

**12.00 midday:** From South Bank (pictured), catch the City Hopper, the free inner city ferry, into Brisbane City and grab some lunch at Dockside, one of Brisbane's premier dining areas. After lunch, stroll down the Queen Street Mall – Brisbane's central business and shopping district.

**3.00 pm:** If you like the outdoors, head to Kangaroo Point where you can cycle, rock climb, or kayak on the Brisbane River. Or, if your feet are sore, rest on a park bench under one of the iconic Moreton Bay figtrees in the Brisbane Botanical Gardens.

**7.00 pm:** There are so many things to do in Brisbane in the evening – watch a live show at the New Farm Powerhouse, sample food from all over the world at the Eat Street Markets or investigate Brisbane's thriving bar and live music scene in Fortitude Valley or West End.






## L Logan


# Our students' stories

## Study at Griffith University (Inbound):

If you are a student at an overseas university you can complete one or two semesters of study at Griffith and earn credit towards your home degree. You can apply to Griffith as either a study abroad or exchange student at both an undergraduate and postgraduate level.

As part of the Study Abroad and Exchange program we offer:

- **Specialised semesters:** become an expert on a subject by studying three or more subjects in one field and receive a specialised semester certificate
- **Community internship program:** volunteer with an Australian organisation for a semester to gain professional experience, get to know the Australian community, and earn credit points towards your degree
- **Study Abroad and Exchange student activities:** get to know your fellow students and become acquainted with the beautiful Australian environment through our events.

### Who is a Study Abroad student?

If your home university is not a Griffith exchange partner you can apply to study here as a Study Abroad student. If you are a Study Abroad student, you pay a set tuition fee for the semester. Fee information can be found here:



## Undergraduate degrees

### Bachelor degree

A bachelor degree is the main type of undergraduate university qualification. Bachelor degrees are between three and four years long. You learn through a combination of lectures, tutorials and private study. Your bachelor degree may also offer you the opportunity to streamline your interests with a major or minor specialisation.

- ▶ **Major:** A major is a sequence of at least 60 credit points (normally six courses) allowing you to specialise in a particular area of interest. You begin your major in second year.
- ▶ **Award major:** An award major is a major printed on your testamur upon graduation and requires 80 credit points (eight courses).
- ▶ **Minor:** A minor is a sequence of at least 30 credit points (three courses), which allows you to specialise in a particular area of interest.

### Double degree

A double degree allows you to complete two degrees in less time than it would take to complete them separately, eg. two three year degrees in four years. Upon successful completion, the University confers two awards.

### Honours

The honours degree is both a pathway to a higher degree by research and a means of gaining advanced knowledge and skills for professional or highly skilled work. Griffith University offers the following three ways to complete honours:

1. Enter a one year bachelor honours degree after graduating from a bachelor degree in the same discipline. Check the programs and courses website to find detailed entry requirements for one-year honours degrees.
2. Enter a bachelor degree and, at some point during your degree, apply to transfer to a bachelor honours degree.
3. Enter a four-year (or more) bachelor honours degree and graduate with honours.

## Postgraduate degrees

### Graduate Certificate

A graduate certificate is usually one semester of full-time study. It equips you with specialised knowledge and skills, and can be a pathway into a graduate diploma, masters, or masters advanced degree.

### Graduate Diploma

A graduate diploma is usually two semesters (one year) of full-time study. It provides you with ongoing professional development. It can be a pathway into a masters, or masters advanced degree as well as, in some cases, higher degree by research programs.

### Masters

A masters degree is usually one to two years of full-time study. It enhances your professional skills, and gives you an in-depth understanding of a specific knowledge area.

### Masters advanced

With some specialisations you can apply to transfer from a masters degree to a masters advanced degree. The masters advanced degree gives you the option to either undertake a research project (dissertation) to equip you with the skills you need to do a higher degree by research, or coursework to enhance your professional expertise.

### Professional doctorate

A professional doctorate is an integrated program of professional and research work that contributes to the creation of new knowledge.

## Higher Degree by Research (HDR) degrees

### Master of Philosophy

The Master of Philosophy (MPhil) is awarded for a thesis, drafted under supervision, which presents original research and demonstrates both knowledge of a research topic and discipline. It is shorter than a PhD.

### Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) is awarded for a thesis, drafted under supervision, which makes an original, significant, and extensive contribution to knowledge and understanding in your field of study.

## What will my study cost?

### Tuition fees

International students are required to pay tuition fees. You are an international student if you are NOT:

- ▶ an Australian or New Zealand citizen
- ▶ a person who has Australian permanent resident status

You will find the 2016 indicative annual fee for each degree on pages 24 to 37 of this prospectus. Indicative annual fees are calculated on the basis of 80 credit points of study (two semesters) only. Actual annual fees may vary in accordance with your choices of majors and electives and whether you study in Summer Semester. Tuition fees are reviewed and increased each year.

### Other fees

As well as tuition fees you will be required to pay:

### Marking

Griffith University uses the seven-point grading scale (where seven (7) is the highest grade awarded and one (1) is the lowest).

- 7 – High Distinction
- 6 – Distinction
- 5 – Credit
- 4 – Pass
- 3 or less – Fail

### Grade point average (GPA)

Your grade point average (GPA) is the measure used for academic achievement at Griffith University.

Your GPA is calculated using your grades and the credit point value of the courses you have completed. The Queensland Institute of Business and Technology (QIBT) provides you with the closest alternative to direct entry to a degree at Griffith University. For over 18 years QIBT has successfully bridged the academic and English gap for over 13,500 students. QIBT's high quality courses are equivalent to university-level study, and are based on the University campus so you can achieve your goal of becoming a successful Griffith University graduate.

## 2 Check if you are eligible for credit

If you have existing formal qualifications, you may be eligible to receive credit for previous studies. Follow the instructions at [griffith.edu.au/admissions/credit](http://griffith.edu.au/admissions/credit) to find out how to apply.

## 3 Prepare supporting documentation

- ▶ a certified copy of your academic results (translated into English if applicable)
- ▶ a certified copy of your English test results (if available) AND
- ▶ if you are applying for a music or visual arts degree you may need to submit a portfolio of work, or audition (see individual program for details)

### Sponsored students must also supply documents confirming:

- ▶ sponsor
- ▶ program(s) being supported
- ▶ duration of support
- ▶ inclusions such as tuition fees and Overseas Student Health Cover

### How do I get my results certified?

A Justice of the Peace (JP) or other public notary—lawyer, policeman, solicitor, embassy official—must see your original documents, and sign and stamp the copies for you.

If you enrol in an online degree you are not eligible for an Australian student visa. Online degrees can be studied part-time and all materials/assessment are online.

**E** – External

If you enrol in an external degree you are not eligible for an Australian student visa. External degrees can be studied part-time. Some materials/assessment are online while other materials/assessment are delivered by alternative methods.

## Credit points (CP)

Credit Point (CP) refers to the value of a course. As a guide one course is worth 10 CP, however this may differ depending on the area of study. The program guide contains the total number of credit points each program is worth.

## Duration (Years)

Unless stated otherwise, all program durations (years) are for full time study. You must study full-time on campus to be eligible for a student visa. For most programs a full-time study load is 80 credit points per year (or 40 credit points per semester).

## English language entry requirements

Each Griffith degree has English language entry requirements. You can check the minimum overall International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score for your degree in the program pages of the prospectus. Below is a list of all other tests we accept, and the corresponding results, based on our most common IELTS score:

- A minimum overall band score of 6.5 on IELTS (Academic) (no sub-score less than 6.0)
- OR a minimum score of 575 on TOEFL
- OR an internet-based (iBT) TOEFL score of 79 (no sub-score less than 19)
- OR no score less than 3+ in each skill of the ISLPR (conducted by ISLPR Language Services only)
- OR a minimum grade of C on the Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE)
- OR a minimum grade of C on the Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)
- OR an overall score of 61 in the Pearson Test of English (Academic) with a minimum of 54 in all Communicative Skills.

If your program requires a higher IELTS score, check [griffith.edu.au/degree-career-finder](http://griffith.edu.au/degree-career-finder) for more information. Griffith does not accept test results more than two-years old.

## Undergraduate academic entry requirements

Entry to a Griffith undergraduate degree usually requires successful completion of a secondary school qualification equivalent to Australian year 12. Griffith has the following undergraduate entry requirements:
